Why it is needed	Assessing malaria burden, using data to inform planning, and measuring progress are critical to fighting malaria—particularly as transmission decreases and infections become increasingly localized.
How it works	Health care workers send information on suspected and confirmed malaria cases, as well as supplies of medicines and diagnostics, over data-enabled mobile phones to a centralized server every week.
Impact	Countries using this system now know exactly how much malaria they have in real-time and where it is. This information improves decision-making and identifies where resources are needed most, helping to stop potential outbreaks.
